## Strategies to be employed:

- · Create a joint committee with representatives from Galway GAA, Galway LGFA, and Galway Camogie to oversee the collaboration and coordination of activities and resources.
- Develop a shared vision and mission statement that reflects the values and objectives of the three organizations.
- · Organise joint events and initiatives that celebrate the diversity and inclusivity of Gaelic games.
- Evaluate and monitor the progress and impact of the partnership, and seek feedback and suggestions from members and the wider GAA community.



Uniting Gaelic Games in Galway at Club Level

Strategic Goal: To foster a culture of collaboration and inclusion among the clubs affiliated with Galway GAA, Galway LGFA, and Galway Camogie, in order to enhance the quality and participation of Gaelic games for all at club level.

## Strategic to be employed:

- Establish a network of club integration liaison officers who will support and facilitate clubs in their integration journey.
- Develop and implement a club integration plan that outlines the goals, actions, timelines, and indicators of success for each club, and provide guidance and support for the clubs to achieve their integration objectives.
- · Recognise and reward the clubs that demonstrate excellence and innovation in integration.
- · Create and share a club integration toolkit that contains useful resources and information for the clubs to promote and implement integration, such as case studies, best practices, tips, templates, and contacts.
